Hi Hope (and fellow commissioners) – below are some thoughts on the draft master plan.

I spent my review time thinking about how to make the document "stickier" in the sense that it's harder to waver from it when making policy decisions; and more directly tied to the (I believe unprecedented) public input we received. My suggestions:

- 1. For each theme area, I'd like to add to the vision/goal bullet points or include, as a separate heading, specific references to ordinances, statutes, or other plans relevant to the theme particularly if it includes hard-number data or other constraining/enabling info from other efforts. The idea: Reinforce, to everyone who references this document, that it is built on a <u>lot</u> of related work with very clear objectives, not just goals pulled from thin air. Examples might include the growth-management cap on housing units per year, population projections, economic data, etc.
- 2. We have an immense amount of public input. Do we have enough verbatim input to add relevant quotes/input from residents in each theme section? My goal here isn't prettying up the document; it's to reinforce that the master plan reflects real people with and real opinions in the community. My hope: That makes it easier for those making policy decisions to abide by the plan's recommendations.

I'm sorry I won't be at the workshop, and I welcome all your opinions on these ideas.
